Dear Friends,

On March 16, 2008, the congregation of Ogden Presbyterian Church voted to approve the following motion:

Ogden Presbyterian Church, 2400 S. Union Street, Spencerport, New York 14559 (the "Church") to convey to Aurora House of Western Monroe County, Inc, a New York not-for-profit corporation, with offices in Spencerport, New York ("Aurora House") a parcel of land approximately 1.85 acres in size, to be subdivided from a parcel approximately 49.6 acres in size, known as 2477 Union Street, owned by the Church and located on the west side of Union Street, opposite the Church building, and acquired by the Church by Deed recorded May 8, 1817, in the Genesee County Clerk's Office, in Liber 2 of Transcripts, page 497 (Tax Map #101.04-2-8) for the purpose of permitting the Aurora House to construct and operate a 2 unit hospice home, such conveyance to be without consideration, except that Aurora House shall pay all of the costs associated with such conveyance, including but not limited to subdivision and site plan approvals, necessary judicial approvals, and customary closing expenses, including the Church's attorney's fees. Such conveyance shall also be subject to a title report that allows Ogden Presbyterian Church to donate this property, and clause in the deed transferring the property that states that if the Aurora House ceases to exist, that this property will revert back to Ogden Presbyterian Church.

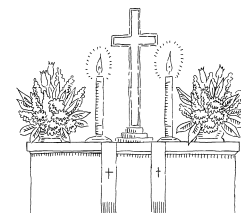

## From the Deacons - Clothes Closet Donations

**Aurora House Vote** On Sunday, March 16, 2008, the congregation approved the motion to donate 1.85 acres of land from the 49.7 acres of OPC property at 2477 S. Union St.. The vote was 68 in favor and 6 opposed. Wording was added to the motion to make sure that the property currently has no restriction on transfers and for the return of the donation if the Aurora House were to fail. The next steps of the process are to request Presbytery approval on April 1, 2008, and then for New York State Supreme Court approval. Construction is planned for 2009.

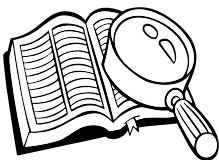

## Crop Walk 2008 Walking with the World

Spencerport residents will be gearing up to join in the Spencerport area Crop Walk to be held on Sunday, May 4, at 1:00 PM. Registration will begin at 12:30 PM.

The walk this year will begin at the Methodist Church on Amity Street, walk along the canal path to the bridge in Adams Basin, and return.

Organized and sponsored locally by the Spencerport Ecumenical Council Ministry, the Spencerport area Crop Walk is to help stop hunger in our community, nationally, and around the world, through self help development initiatives. Twenty five percent of the money raised here in the Spencerport area will go to the local Food Shelf.

The Spencerport area Crop Walk is one of some 2000 interfaith community Crop Walks taking place around the country.

Last year Ogden Presbyterian Church had 15 members walk out of a total of 83 participants from all the Spencerport churches. We contributed \$791 out of a total of \$6680 from the participants.

The members of our church can contribute to this Crop Walk in two ways. They can register to walk from Spencerport to Adams Basin and return. The walkers will solicit pledges from individuals. The second way to support this worthy cause is to pledge financially to the members of OPC that are walking.

The Mission Committee will have the applications for the walkers. Please consider helping in this cause. It impacts the mission of our church in a world wide way. Remember, a crop hunger walk is fun, but it is also an opportunity to learn what millions of people have to do each day just to survive - they walk. When you walk in a Crop hunger walk, you walk with the world.

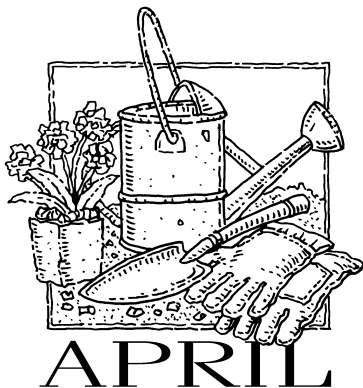
