## Session Highlights - March 16, 2009

- Pastor Sudi reported that the Crop Walk is scheduled for May 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Good Friday Worship Service will be held at the First Congregational Church at Noon; Easter Sunrise Service will be held at the Gazebo at 7 a.m. The Spencerport Methodist Church is planning the worship service and Easter breakfast. VBS Schedule is set - OPC will be in the July 6-10 group.
- (Community Outreach – John Goehle/Chelsea Metherell) – Session approved the writing of a proposal for a \$600 grant to promote our mission and church; total cost of project is approximately \$1500; biggest need is wireless microphones; portable amp would also be nice. Chelsea has some great ideas to bring in youth members. Next SNL is April 26<sup>th</sup> - communion will be served.
- (Christian Education – John Caloritis) – Session approved holding the worship service at the White Church instead of OPC on Sunday, July 12 for VBS presentation. Confirmation class begins May 17 – five youths will be participating.
- (Finance – Dick Malloy) - We're doing fine right now – nothing unexpected. Some income and expenses are impacted by timing. Nothing concerning right now.
- (Discipleship – Molly Corey) – Looking to schedule a one day retreat at a local park. Next Book Club meeting is April 23<sup>rd</sup> at Eclipse on Union Street.
- (Fellowship – Sandy Frieday) – April 4<sup>th</sup> Progressive Dinner will be rescheduled to summer. More details to follow. Session, Deacon, and Trustee photos have been posted on the welcome board at the entrance and in the fellowship hall.
- (Anniversary Committee – Sandy Frieday) – Theme is “OPC – 200 Years of Grace”; our bell will be used in the logo design; Norma has replaced Meghan on the committee; historical data is being gathered.
