## Faith Stories—Continued

Stewardship doesn't just end with the individual. We as a larger church also have to make decisions regarding the use of the resources with which we are entrusted. Last year at this time, we were anxiously awaiting the installation of our new pastor. One year later, and Pastor Sudi is part of our family, one of our great blessings. The children of our church continue to be a source of joy and pride (as well as noise—especially mine). We have many strong backs, who serve as Men at Work around our community, offering their talents to make our community a better place, and to extend and expand the mission of OPC. We have educators who nurture our minds, turning our young people to Christ. We have women who stitch and sew beautiful things—mittens and hats to fend off the cold of western NY winters, and beautiful quilts to comfort those who need solace. My father-in-law was blessed by the stewardship of these women recently. Pastor Sudi handed me the soft flannel quilt on a cold, low night this past week, and holding it, I could feel the love that went into its creation. It was a comfort beyond the mere coziness of soft cotton, beautifully pieced. These are all ways in which individuals among you serve as “the church” and the church is blessed to have you.

“The church” also has a building, which we tend, where the amazing feat of service and organization that is the Harvest Fest occurs, where births and baptisms, marriages, and lives are celebrated, as the life of Les Smith was celebrated, and where Bible Studies and Scouts and Youth Groups gather. Our church also has a parcel of land, 50 acres just a little ways south on Union Street. For many years the Boy Scouts have camped and played on this land, and it is our hope that they will continue to do so for many more. As a church though, we must not just sit back on our laurels and congratulate ourselves for the many fine things we have accomplished. We must constantly be on the lookout for new ways to use our gifts for the betterment of our world. As many of you know, there is an effort spearheaded by our own Joanne Ville's daughter-in-law to create a hospice house in our community. Aurora House, as it is to be called, would allow those who are in the last months of their lives to continue to remain and be tended within the community where they are loved. If it takes a village to raise a child, it certainly takes a village and a great deal of caring to birth a person from this life into the next and to support the family during this often difficult transition. The church has been involved with fundraising for Aurora House. We wondered, however, if there weren't more ways for us to help turn Aurora House from dream into reality. To this end, we wanted you to consider the donation of a small, one acre portion of the 50 acres we have in our care to serve as the site for Aurora House. We would not run Aurora House, or be in charge of it, although surely there will be much work to do in creating and continuing Aurora House, work which would require the use of our talents - those of our nurturers, our builders, our youth and our Scouts. You are the church, and the decision is yours. When the research is complete, and we have the information necessary, we will be bringing this proposal to you for your vote. Please begin to consider today, how you wish to serve and support the mission of our church, and how you feel our church should serve our greater community.

The other day while I was driving to work, an old Bob Dylan song came on the radio. “You're gonna have to serve somebody; it may be the devil or it may be the Lord, but you're gonna have to serve somebody.” The song goes on to say that whether you're a leader, whether you are rich or poor, you serve someone. If you know how to cut hair, or build houses, then that is what you will do, that's how you will offer your service. It got me thinking. We each serve according to our gifts, according to our *God given talents*. But even if we don't choose to serve, when we hide our light under a bushel, or bury our money in the ground or the bank, we are still serving somebody. We are either serving God with our gifts - and there are many ways to do so - or we are not. Don't for a moment be deluded into thinking that if you don't choose to use the gifts of time, or money, or talent entrusted to you by God, that you haven't made a choice about where you place your priorities. 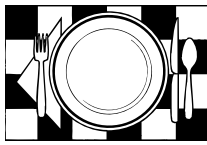

Stephanie is the Summer Events coordinator for the group, planning activities for the children & their host families during their visit here. She & her family have hosted children seven times, & she has chaperoned the children from Belfast to Rochester twice.
