Dear Friends,

How do people join a church? How is it that people have the experiences, develop the relationships and feel in their hearts, that they want to become a member of a particular congregation? How does that happen? It is a complex question, one that we probably don't think about much.

I believe the answer lies in a combination of factors. People join churches for all kinds of reasons: The music, the location, the programs, the pastor, people they already know in the congregation, people they get to know in the congregation. Different people join a church for different reasons.

But before people can join a church, they have to get to church. How does that happen? How do people come to church for the first time? There are three main approaches. The first is what I call the biological method. Here people come to church for the first time with a family member, most often their parents. The second method of getting people to church is what I call the fly-paper strategy, we hope and wish and wait that someone will buzz by the church, stop in and get stuck on it, stuck on us. Then we've got 'em. All we do is hope and wish and wait. The third reason people come to church for the first time is because someone invites them. The invitation method is, by far, the best way to get people to visit a church for the first time. All the experts agree. It's more reliable than the biological approach and it's more appropriate theologically. Instead of waiting around, hoping and wishing that someone would land on church and get stuck, we should go out and invite folks to join us. Welcoming new people into the church is part of what it means to be Christian.

"How are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him?" (Romans 10:14) And how are they going to come into the church unless someone invites them? There are two things that are important to note:

1. Are you feeling good enough about our church that we want to share that with other people? We have to feel good about our church to invite other people to join us. If we don't have that feeling, well, we need to talk. We need to hear about your concerns and we need to hear your suggestions for improvements. But if you do have the feeling that what we have here is a good thing, important and meaningful to you, then why would you not want to share that with someone else?

2. Being aware of whom to invite! It may be somebody moving in next door or down the street. it may be a colleague at work; it may be a friend or an acquaintance from some other organization; it may be somebody who used to attend here, but has drifted away. We have to open our eyes, our ears and our minds for people to invite. They're out there. As diverse a membership as we have, we have contact with lots of folks and the potential to invite lots of folks to join us here.

If you come here and you like it, ask someone to come with you. Remember, how are they going to come into the church, unless someone invites them? How are they going to come, unless you invite them?

Highlights of Presbytery Meeting

A special meeting of the Presbytery was held on July 22 at Corfu Presbyterian Church to act on increased activities of the Presbytery. The following are the highlights of the meeting:

- Two candidates were presented for approval of ordination to ministry of Word and Sacrament. In addition they were called to Covington Presbyterian Church and Holley Presbyterian Church. One additional Pastor was called to Third Presbyterian Church.
- There were four departures of Pastors from PGV. Dan McCollister resigned from Caledonia Stone Church, Ralph English resigned from Gates Presbyterian Church, Lynn Rubier-Capron resigned from Stone Bergen and our former Interim Pastor, Mike Capron resigned from Christ Clarion. (Pastor Mike will assume the position as Pastor in Hopewell, NJ)
- A discussion was scheduled on the docket for the 2008 Summer of Discernment. This involved the total process to install a Co-Presbyter in PGV to serve with Linda Badger Becker as the other Co-Presbyter. due to the scheduled docket time that was one hour earlier for this discussion, the discussion was rescheduled for the docket of the special meeting of PGV on August 26 at Barre Center Presbyterian Church.

Native American Awareness Day

Every year on the Fall Equinox, the Presbyterian Church (USA) recognizes Native American people in our denomination, and in our society. We celebrated the first Native day in our presbytery in 1995 at a Warsaw Presbyterian meeting. The Native Day overture that passed in 1994 is also an important part of my belief in mission outreach. Included in the celebration was Seneca Elder Warren Skye, GA Mission leader Marj Carpenter and General Assembly Native Congregations' leader, Rev. Harrel Davis.(Dakota) to lead us in all Native hymns and prayers !



So why celebrate when there are no American Indians at OPC? (Actually one of our members has Seneca lineage.) We celebrate because Jesus told us to love our neighbors. How do we do that when we don't know anything about them??? So Native American Day is a chance to read a Native prayer or sing a Native hymn; make a donation to local Native organizations or invite a guest speaker in to teach us of their culture; visit the Tonawanda Indian Presbyterian Church, Ganondagan historic site or Canandaigua treaty day. There are Native books , videos and worship materials at the Presbytery Resource Center. Take time to learn local culture to dispel the myths and stereotypes. From confusion over casinos, land claims, their poverty rates and racism issues, we have much to learn. Do you know the Six Iroquois nations in NY? How many Indians live in Rochester? What the 1794 Canandaigua Treaty represents in a court of law? How many Native Presbyterian churches exist in the US? If not, give me a call :) I'll also be glad to deliver any donations for you to local Native people who still often struggle in society.
